A Revolutionary Experience

From the early stirrings of unrest in Boston to the opening shots of the War of Independence, and from signing of the Declaration of Independence to the creation of the American Republic, the Museum's core exhibition explores the ideas, events, and legacies of America's revolutionary beginnings. The rumblings of the American Revolution began more than a decade before the "shot heard 'round the world" ignited America's War for Independence. Discover how the American Colonists became Revolutionaries as the roots of rebellion took hold.

Eastern State Penitentiary

Eastern Penitentiary opened in 1829 as part of a controversial movement to change the behavior of inmates through confinement in solitude with labor. Based on the philosophy that crime is the result of environment and solitude will make the criminal regretful and penitent, inmates were kept isolated. Cells were equipped with feed doors and individual exercise yards. Over time, the penitentiary expanded, and in 1924 inmates first ate in a group dining hall. Riots occurred over the years, and the prison housed many infamous criminals. It was closed in 1970.

Moshulu

Moshulu is the only restaurant in the world operating on a ship. Built in 1904 in Scotland, it was a state-of-the art cargo ship in its day. It sailed around Cape Horn 54 times. In WW I, the U.S. confiscated the ship. It was purchased by Finland in 1924 but then taken by Germany in WW II. The ship fell into hard times and was purchased for restoration to become a museum/restaurant and moved to Philadelphia waterfront.
