This year's candidates included a robust field of nine qualified applicants who completed a total of 14 applications for the four scholarships. After reviewing both academic eligibility and financial need, the committee is pleased to announce the following:

The 2022-23 Member Memorial Scholarship (\$1,500) is awarded to **Alanis Castro Pacheco** from Enola. Alanis is a sophomore at Susquehanna University majoring in Luxury Brand Marketing Management and Graphic Design. In addition to her studies, Alanis volunteers as a youth leader and serves as a mentor at local high schools and Girl Scout troops. She also serves as her sorority's Director of Alumnae Relations.

The 2022-23 Krausse STEM Scholarship (\$1,500) is awarded to **Brianna Watts** from Duncannon. Brianna is a senior at Susquehanna University, majoring in Biochemistry and Physics. Brianna is a model student and recipient of a competitive summer research scholarship that culminated in research presentations and two scholarly publications.
