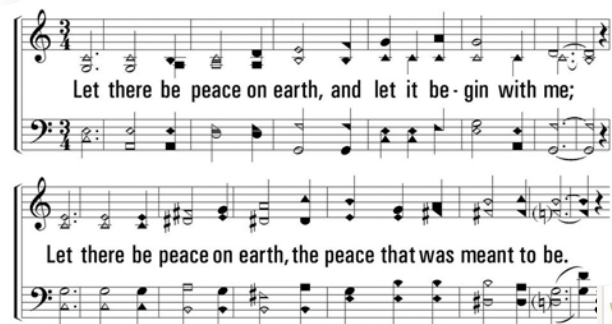

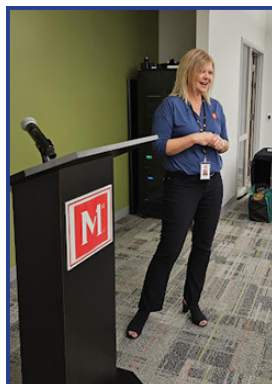

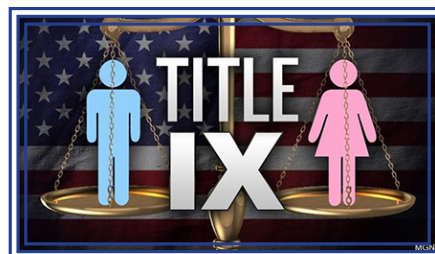
Public Policy Updates, Links, and Events with Public Policy Chair, Kathy Gates

PA at the Capitol steps to press Governor Shapiro and members of the Basic Education Funding Commission (BEFC) that their final report **must** include a clear and thorough calculation of how much each school district needs to meet the constitutional obligation to our students (known as adequacy targets).



Peg Pennecker, our September luncheon speaker, sent us an update that the new Title IX regulations that she spoke about in September during her presentation have been delayed **again**. The anticipated release is now Spring 2024. Per the article by senior reporter Naaz Moan in **K-12 DIVE** published Oct. 31, 2023

"Final Title IX rules delayed once more as Ed Dept misses deadline"

DIVE Brief:

- The U.S. Department of Education missed its October deadline to finalize two long-awaited sets of Title IX regulations, delaying their release once more. The department has not announced a new date of expected release.
- As of Tuesday, the Office of Management and Budget, which reviews any rule before it's finalized, hadn't reviewed either of the rules, one on athletics and the other containing broader Title IX guidance, according to the agency's website. OMB reviews can take up to 90 days.
- The delay comes as nearly 130 civil rights, gender justice, and survivor advocacy organizations urged "immediate action" and said the administration's decision to keep the Trump administration-era rule in place is "a worrying and dangerous trend." 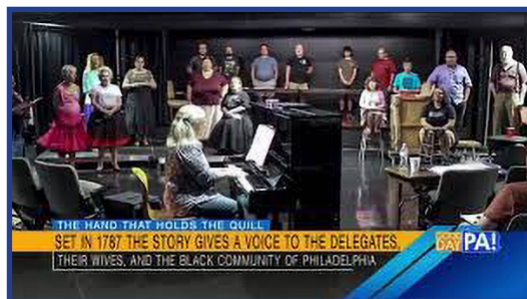

On Cindy's Facebook page on November 22, 2023, Cindy Dlugolecki and Chris Purcell announced exciting news. **QUILL-ADELPHIA**, the musical formerly known as **THE HAND THAT HOLDS THE QUILL**, has been invited to be part of a festival to showcase new musicals. The festival, organized by **Theatre on the Verge**, will be in March in Jenkintown outside Philadelphia. This unique opportunity includes rehearsal time in a sound studio or the Abington Art Center; a band or piano accompanist; an invitation to attend all master classes, workshops, and social events *for free*; a video recording of the performance to use as they desire; assistance with publicity promotional materials for the duration of the three-day festival.

QUILL is one of ten or so finalists, chosen from 75 submissions.

Cindy says that the musical has been edited quite a bit since QUILL's first production in September 2021 at Capital BlueCross Theatre at Central Penn College. Encouraged by Janet Bixler, who oversaw QUILL's first production, and her belief in the project, Chris and Cindy kept writing and re-writing. And now QUILL will be close to Philadelphia, where it belongs! **INDEED!**
