"The Face of Harrisburg: David Biser does more than portray John Harris Jr.; he inhabits him."

David Biser fills many roles in the Harrisburg community - historical researcher, reenactor, author, pastor. But, perhaps one of his most enduring contributions to the area will be his first person interpretation in full costume of John Harris, Jr., the founder of Harrisburg and Dauphin County, and the book it generated. David has been introducing Harris to the public for 20 years. To some, he possibly "is" John Harris, Jr., as he steps up to the crowd to have a conversation (as) John Harris -

from reflections on his father who

had begun a ferry service across

the Susquehanna River, or some of

his friends in Philadelphia writing

a Declaration of Independence, to his vision for this land he stands on as an ambitious new town, Harrisburg, where he eventually played a leading role in establishing Dauphin Country, with Harrisburg as its seat. As David grew into his role, and did years of intensive research, he came to realize that there were bits and pieces of information everywhere, but not a co-ordinated and in depth presentation of the massive amount

of details that made up this man and

his contributtions to our history. After five

years of detailed research "to gather facts and to sort out misconceptions and previous errors" David determined that it was time




to produce "a concise, but information packed read on John Harris' life." At last, on January 16, 2024, an official book launch was held in the Capitol Rotund and Visionary Road to the Capital: The Little Known Story of John Harris Jr, was a reality.

David Biser has embraced his local community from his graduation from Cedar Cliff High School, to joining the Donegal Township Riflemen portraying life in the Lancaster County militia in the 1700s, to earning his BA in Christian Education from Messiah College and an MDiv at Palmer Seminary (formerly Eastern Baptist Seminary). His John Harris Jr era began when the Historical Society of Dauphin County

asked him to play John Harris Jr. on behalf of the society and agreed to his interpreting of Harris' life, not just the dress.





Thursday, March 26, 2026 - Baltimore Museum of Art - Amy Sherald: American Sublime "American Sublime is a salve. It's a call to remember our shared humanity and an insistence on being seen." —Amy Sherald

The exhibition tells the story of Sherald's vision and practice through approximately 40 paintings created from 2007 to the present—from her early, rarely seen works to her iconic, larger-than-life portraits of Black Americans in everyday moments. Sherald graduated from the Maryland Institute College of Art, studying under the famed painter Grace Hartigan, and worked in Baltimore during her formative years. Ms. Sherald the first African American to win the grand prize in the National Portrait Gallery's Outwin Boochever Portrait Competition. That recognition led to the commission of the official portrait of former First Lady Michelle Obama for the National Portrait Gallery's collection.
